






Figure 1. Typical Output Characteristics




Figure 3. Typical Saturation Voltage Characteristics




Figure 5. Saturation Voltage vs. V<sub>GE</sub>




Figure 2. Typical Output Characteristics




Figure 4. Saturation Voltage vs. Case Temperature at Variant Current Level




Figure 6. Saturation Voltage vs. V<sub>GE</sub>




Figure 7. Capacitance Characteristics




Figure 9. Turn-on Characteristics vs.
Gate Resistance




Figure 11. Switching Loss vs.
Gate Resistance




Figure 8. Gate Charge Characteristics




Figure 10. Turn-off Characteristics vs. Gate Resistance




Figure 12. Turn-on Characteristics vs. Collector Current




Figure 13. Turn-off Characteristics vs. Collector Current




Figure 15. Load Current vs. Frequency




Figure 17. Forward Characteristics




Figure 14. Switching Loss vs. Collector Current




Figure 16. SOA Characteristics




Figure 18. Reverse Recovery Current




Figure 19. Reverse Recovery Time




Figure 20. Stored Charge




Figure 21. Transient Thermal Impedance of IGBT


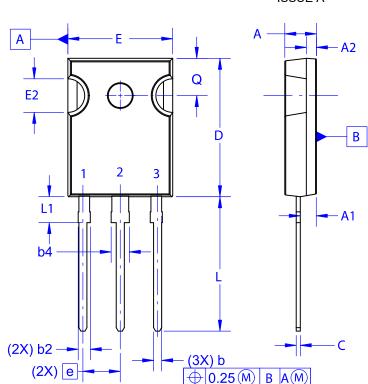


Figure 22. Transient Thermal Impedance of Diode


